


NOTE TO TEACHERS.

The questions in this book take up, in order, the whole Gospel of Luke, with but very few references to either of the other Gospels. It was thought that in this way the pupil would get a clearer idea of the life of Jesus than by selecting passages from all the four accounts. A knowledge of the events in this life, just as they are told in the Bible, is a necessary preliminary to all deeper study, and a knowledge to which every child has a right; though of late years this right is often overlooked.

The object of this manual is to lead the child to find out and learn the very words of the Bible, leaving comments and discussions of difficult points to a later period. All the explanations given are as short and simple as possible. The teacher must use his own judgment how much to add to them. The questions left without answers are such as the children ought to be able to answer for themselves. The teachers must be careful that the children really give that part of the verse referred to, and that only, which contains the answer to the question. If not taught otherwise they will usually read the whole verse without taking the trouble to select the proper answer.

The books referred to in some of the answers are all within the easy reach of every teacher. The passages in these books should be looked out beforehand, and read or repeated to the class.
