PREFACE TO THE SECOND VOLUME.

WHEN the first volume of the "Kennel Stud Book" was issued it was "intended to publish every two years the entries of young Hounds." That, however, from various causes, was not carried out.

At the earnest request of many influential Masters of Hounds, the second volume is now produced, containing the entries of some of the most celebrated old-established Packs from whence Sires are principally sought, and so arranged that all pedigrees of both sexes can readily be traced to their ancestors in the original work.

It is confidently hoped that this volume may be considered of value, and meet with sufficient support as to warrant a reproduction of a similar work in future every two or three years.

EXPLANATORY NOTES.

THE figures in line with the names refer to pages in the original "Kennel Stud Book," where further pedigrees will be found.

THE dates over the names of Sires and Dams denote the year when those were entered whose pedigrees previously appear in this work.

THE few Hounds not traceable direct to the first volume will be found at the end of the respective entries.

IN all cases Hounds are understood to belong to those Kennels where they were *entered*, whether bred at home or procured from other establishments; thus their pedigrees are readily found.
