

Two full-length figures in white dresses, standing at a harpsichord, looking at the spectator; one is playing the instrument, while the other leans on it; both girls wear large white caps trimmed with flowers and ribbons; brown background. EARL OF NORMANTON.

Sir Joshua Reynolds, P.R.A.

Daughter of the 1st Baron Ravensworth; m. 1st 1756, Augustus Henry, Earl of Euston, afterwards 3rd Duke of Grafton; was divorced from him in 1769; m. 2ndly, John Fitzpatrick, 2nd Earl of Upper Ossory; d. 1804. Half figure to r., three-quarter profile; black low-out dress and fur-trimmed clock; she holds up some flowers in her r. hand; landscape background. Painted about 1764. Canvas, 30 by 241 in.

Portrait of THE RIGHT HON. JOHN THURLOE.

LORD THUBLOW.

William Dobson.

B. 1616 at Roding Abbey, Essex; son of the rector of the parish; held several important offices; was Secretary of State to Oliver Cromwell in 1653; M.P. for Ely 1656, and for Cambridge University 1658; d. 1668. Three-quarter figure seated to r. in a high-backed arm-chair, holding a letter addressed to himself in his r. hand; black velvet cloak, wide falling collar

and cuffs, long hair; dark background. Canvas, 49 by 391 in.
