



PREFATORY NOTE

WITH the exception of four or five items, the books dealt with in the following pages are confined to Complete Volumes of Biography and Criticism, &c. The exceptions (Joseph Forster's Great Teachers, and Stopford Brooke's Theology in the English Poets, for example) have been admitted because of their importance to the student of Coleridge, although they are not devoted exclusively to the Life and Writings of that Poet. In all such instances the name of Coleridge in the transcripts of the title-pages has been printed in capitals.

No attempt has been made to compile a list of the mass of Minor Coleridgeiana which exists in Magazines, Newspapers, and other repositories. The bulk of this is so enormous, that were it to be collected and tabulated the usefulness of the result attained would fail to compensate for the expenditure of time and labour its arrangement and analysis would entail.
