### PREFACE.

THIS little volume of selections from Féneion is based chiefly on a recent translation by Mrs. H. L. Sidney Lear, published by Rivingtons, London, in two volumes; one of spiritual letters to men, the other to women. on comparing this translation with the French, that, although generally faithful, and very easy and felicitous, it did not follow the original so closely as I should desire, and therefore I have altered it freely in order to express the thoughts of Fénelon as nearly as possible in his own words, and not in a paraphrase. I am also largely indebted to Mrs. Follen's translation, which I have altered, whenever necessary, for the same reason. For a portion of the "Christian Counsels" which follow the Letters, I must express my thanks to Mr. George P. Bradford,

who has kindly allowed me to make use of a small volume of selections from Fénelon, anonymously published by him many years ago. The brief memoir of Fénelon is condensed from a Life of the Archbishop by the English translator above-mentioned, with connecting sentences and paragraphs occasionally supplied from the Memoir by Mrs. Follen.
