4. **WITH REGARD TO BOARDERS,** their education, health, training, and religious instruction are carefully attended to. Recreation is mingled with study, and opportunities for social intercourse are provided. The Council of the College recognise the keen competition there is now between schools, and they are determined that in **EVERY RESPECT** the Ladies' College shall be kept in the front rank. Delicate girls, girls laid aside by illness, and young girls receive special attention. Each boarder goes to her own church.
