

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE INTEREST WAKENED BY THIS NEW DISCOVERY

THE Egypt Exploration Fund has now for some years been searching in likely places for remains of early times.

In 1897 it was rewarded by a remarkable discovery of a page of a book which contained Sayings of Jesus. This was at Oxyrynchus, once one of the chief cities of ancient Egypt.
