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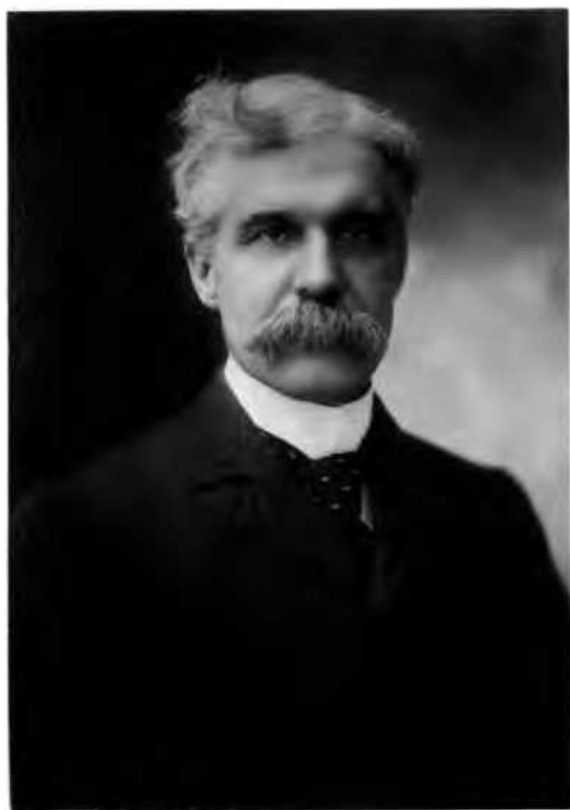

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NOTE.

THE owners of Plates Nos. 45, 49, and 51 prefer that their names shall not be disclosed. Plates Nos. 101 and 124, while practically completed, are still in the hands of the engraver.

That piece of burlesque heraldry, with its mystifying motto, U · SEPE · ARS · SO · AP, produced as a joke in an idle moment, as well as the copy of the Samuel Vaughan book-plate, engraved as a study of the so-called "Chippendale" style,—to which fictitious and impossible arms and the name "Timothy Jones" were added and the name afterward erased,—although of interest to collectors, are not a part of Mr. French's serious work, and he has always protested against their being placed in any list of his book-plates.

Subscribers will receive in January, 1900, a list of such plates as may have been engraved by Mr. French during the present year.
