PREFATORY LETTER

DEAR MISS BURLEIGH:

And may I congratulate you and your readers on the fact, rare in this field, that this book of yours has been produced by one who is a worker both in the theatre and in the community; for the fusion of the arts of the one with the aspirations of the other is the practical ideal of the community theatre.
