**Anderson, J. P.** Bibliography [of Dickens]. (In Marzials, Frank T. Life of Charles Dickens. 1887. BD548M.)

Is arranged as follows: I. Works. II. Selections. III. Single works. IV. Miscellaneous works. V. Appendix—Biographical, critical, etc.; Dramatic; Musical; Parodies and imitations; Poetical; Magazine and newspaper articles. VI. Chronological list of works. Has some annotations.

**Clark, J. Scott.** Bibliography on Dickens's style. (In his Study of English prose writers. 1905c1898. p. 610-612. 820.1C59.)

A list of references to books and periodicals.

**Cook, James.** Bibliography of the writings of Charles Dickens; with many curious and interesting particulars relating to his works. 1879. R012D54C

Has annotations. Purports to include the titles of all of Dickens's known writings, with notices of re-issues, and to furnish material for a thorough knowledge of the peculiarities of the several editions, etc. Information is given as to the sale of Dickens's library, art objects, etc.

**Fitzgerald, Percy.** Bibliography of "Pickwick." (In his History of Pickwick. 1891. 823F55.)

Notes first all the "points" which make a true first edition valuable and then gives a bibliography which includes "all the various editions, illustrations, and other matter, that have been engendered by this wonderful book."

**Johnson, Charles P.** Hints to collectors of original editions of the works of Charles Dickens. 1885. 012D54J

A bibliography of the first collected form of Dickens's writings, omitting all scattered papers. In each case the exact title as printed on the title page and a full collation of pages and illustrations are given, as well as notes of differences in editions, the condition of plates, etc., and the market value of the book. A list of plays founded on Dickens's works and a list of portraits of Dickens are also given.

**Kitton, Frederic G.** Dickensiana; a bibliography of the literature relating to Charles Dickens and his writings. 1886. 012D54K

"Personal, critical, poetical, anthological, musical, dramatic, plagiaristic," etc.

— Novels of Charles Dickens; a bibliography and sketch. [pref. 1897]. 823K62

A mine of information as to the circumstances of their writing and publication.

— Minor writings of Charles Dickens; a bibliography and sketch. [pref. 1900]. 823K62M

Similar to the preceding. Gives a vast amount of information as to the minor writings and especially "a complete list of Dickens's ephemeral contributions to periodical literature, notably to those journals of which he himself was editor."

**Pierce, Gilbert A.** A condensed bibliography of the writings of Charles Dickens; based upon the full bibliography prepared by Richard Herne Shepherd. (In his Dickens dictionary. 1894. R823P61D.)

Is arranged by years or groups of years from 1833 to 1882.

[**Shepherd, Richard Herne**]. Bibliography of Dickens; a bibliographical list, arranged in chronological order, of the published writings in prose and verse of Charles Dickens (from 1834 to 1880). [1880]. 012D54S

Annotated. Includes all the accessible printed utterances known to the compiler, "not merely his larger and smaller separate works, but his scattered and uncollected contributions to journals, magazines, annuals, and keepsakes, his letters to newspapers and to friends, and his speeches." Also gives a bibliography of Ana (books, etc., on Dickens).

**Stephen, Sir Leslie.** [List of Dickens's works in chronological order]. (In Stephen, Sir Leslie and Lee, Sir Sidney, ed. Dictionary of national biography. v. xv. (1888), p. 30-31. R920S82).

Gives a list also of miscellaneous publications in *Household Words, All the Year Round*, etc.
