## TO THE READER.

---

THE importance of the Pedigrees taken by the  
Heralds of past times, at their official Visitations, is too well known to all persons who take an interest in Genealogical pursuits to render it necessary for the Editor of a book of this kind to enter into any antiquarian particulars concerning them. Many of these Visitations have been printed, but no general Index of them has been made: hence their utility is much lessened. The present Work is intended to supply this want, and may be said to form a companion volume to Mr. Sims's valuable Catalogue of the Pedigrees recorded in the Heralds' Visitations, in the Harleian and other MSS. in the British Museum. In order to render this book as complete as possible, each Pedigree has been inspected, and the name, if spelt in different ways, doubly indexed, and, as far as possible, the name of the principal place at which the family

resided is added. An Index of the Pedigrees in Berry's County Genealogies, many of which are taken from the Heralds' Visitations preserved in the College of Arms, has also been incorporated.

A list of the books to which references are made is prefixed, that those unacquainted with the works themselves may be the more easily able to identify them. Those of which copies will be found in the Library of the British Museum have the *press-marks* of that Library appended in parentheses, so as to save time and trouble to persons desirous of consulting the copies in our great national collection.

To these brief prefatory remarks it only remains to add, that it is the hope of the Editor that this little volume may be of service to Genealogical students.
