

Whereas by our #clamacon on the 29th: day of Novembr: Instant made and Published for Reasons therein Expressed we have thought fitt to Dissolve ye late Generall Assembly And notwthStanding yt all our Designes and Endeavours to Settle this Pvince in peace and Tranquility, have by the obstinate majorty -- of the House of Comons, been ffrustrated-and willing as ffar as in us Lyes, to Gratifye and Comply wth the Requests of Some, butt the More Modest and Reasonable of the membre-of ye house of Commons and other well . meaning Inhabittants of this Prince by their Address for yt End to us Signified, wee Therefore (hereby Dispensing, wth our power to us in that respect Granted by our Charter and former presidents), Comand you to Sumons all the Kings Leidge Subjects ye ffreemen Inhabittants of Berkley & Craven Countys to be and Appeare. Together wth all the Rest of the freemen as aforesaid of this part of our province at Charles Towne on ye 19th day of December next Then And there by a Majority of their voyces to Agree to And Ascertaine ve number of their Representatives for this part of this Prince To Consult and advise wth: us about makeing such Laws as Shall be necessary for the Safety and defence of this Prince when & as often as we shall see occation To Call them thereto, Wittness John Archdale Esqr: our Govrn - Admirall and Capt Generall of our said Prince and the Rest of our Deputyes at Charles Towne this 30th: day of November 1695/ John Archdale

Wee Returne to yor honors: our most sincere and hearty thanks not only for the Pgress yo' hono' hath allready made towards the Settlemt of this place but allso for yor honors: Speech wherein yor: Honor not only Intimated yor willingness but yor power to putt an End to all those Greiveances that have Soe much hindr'd the settlemt of this Soe hopefull a Collony which willingness of yor- Honor: soe freely Declared we noe ways Doubt and therefore humbly Request yor honor: for our better Guide and Information, (in the way of our Endeavors to pay our uttmost assistance to yor honor in the present Settlemt of, the Same) That yor honor will be pleased to vouchsafe to Comunicate to us yor honors power and the Extent thereof And wee hope yor homor shall have no Reason to Repent of the Same ffor we doe faithfully assure yor Honors that as we would not Neglect any Grace or ffavor Intended us by the honoble: the Lords Pprs: Soe we would not Desire or press any thing beyond yor: honors power to Pforme, but Shall on our prts Give our Utmost
