### Saturday Morning in a Country Store

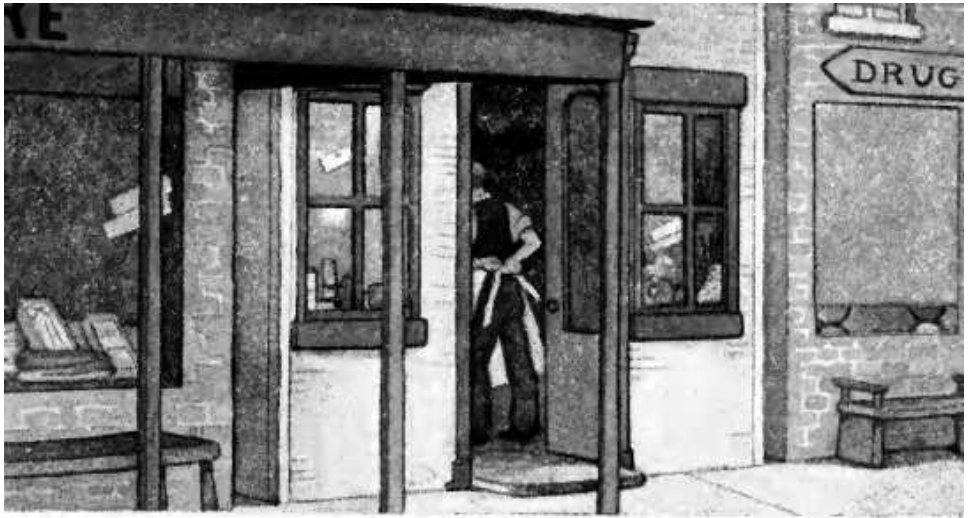
"Look, Dad," said Bob. "The store is open. Joe is here.
