R U L E S
OF THE
MICHIGAN STATE LIBRARY.

RULE I.

The Library shall be kept open on each day (except Sundays and legal holidays) from 8 o'clock A. M. to 12 o'clock M., and from half-past 1 o'clock to 5 o'clock P. M. On Saturdays to 4 o'clock P. M.

RULE II.

No person except members of the Legislature, State officers, and the clerks employed in the public offices, shall be permitted to take from the Library any book, map, or publication belonging thereto.

RULE III.

No book, map, or other publication shall be kept, by any person entitled to take the same from the Library, over ten days at any one time, nor shall more than three volumes be taken at one time by the same person, or on his account.

RULE IV.

Any person detaining any book, map, or other publication belonging to the Library, over ten days at any one time, shall forfeit and pay to the Librarian, for each day's detention, ten cents.

RULE V.

Any person taking any book, map, or other publication from the Library, shall be liable for all damages done thereto while in his possession, which damages shall be assessed by the Librarian, and paid to him or her by the person taking such book, map, or other publication.

RULE VI.

No person who shall refuse or neglect to pay any fine when required by the Librarian, for keeping any book, map, or other publication over ten days, or shall neglect or refuse, for the space of ten days, to pay to the Librarian aforesaid all damages assessed by him or her by virtue of the rules of the Library, after receiving notice of such assessment, shall thereafter be permitted to take any book, map, or other publication, from the Library.

RULE VII.

Any member of the Legislature having in his possession any book, map, or other publication belonging to the Library, shall return the same four days before the adjournment of the Legislature.

RULE VIII.

Three days before the adjournment of the Legislature, the Librarian shall report to the Senate and House of Representatives the name of each member of the Legislature who has not returned *all* books, maps, or other publications taken out of the Library by such member, and settled and paid all accounts for fines, for injuring such books, or otherwise.

RULE IX.

All such books, maps, or other publications as the Governor and Secretary of State shall determine are necessary always to be kept in the Library as books of reference, shall at no time be taken therefrom.

RULE X.

No person, except the one having charge of the Library, shall be permitted to take from or replace in the case, any book, map, or other publication.

RULE XI.

All damages and fines collected by the Librarian by virtue of these rules shall be expended by him or her in the purchase of books for the Library, and an account of all moneys so collected shall be kept by him or her.

RULE XII.

All persons desirous of taking any books, pamphlets, or maps, from the State Library, are required to report to the Librarian the title or titles of such books, pamphlets, or maps, prior to removing the same from the Library rooms.
