## PREFACE

Although there are many excellent books on the subject of Foreign Exchange, few have been written for beginners explaining the essential principles of the science in simple language and with suitable illustrations, and none have been written from a Canadian standpoint.

The first eight chapters of this book were originally written for private circulation among students preparing for the Associates' Course of the Canadian Bankers' Association, and under the title of "Foreign Exchange Arithmetic" gained the approval both of students and of university authorities. It is not intended as a comprehensive treatise on the subject, and little or no attempt has been made at continuity of treatment, but practically every phase of Foreign Exchange has been dealt with.
