PREFACE.

The estimate of Scholars respecting the accuracy of their knowledge of the Ancient MSS. accords with the following declaration of the Edinburgh Review on the subject, No. 249 p. 110, "Indeed, so far as early MSS. are concerned, this work (Rev. E. H. Hansell's "Novum Testamentum Graece") contains almost everything necessary for the revision of the text of the New Testament. Lachmann, Tischendorf, Tregelles, Scrivener, and others, have furnished pretty nearly complete Collations of Ancient versions, and citations, as well as of many later and inferior MSS. So that there is really nothing worth mentioning to wait for." Each Scholar expresses himself as satisfied with the correctness of the knowledge of the Ancient MSS. which he selects and sets forth, and censures any who question its accuracy; but as it is by no means difficult to exhibit the extent of the knowledge of the Ancient MSS. that Scholars do possess, I will proceed to do so; and thus shew, whether any Scholar now has an accurate knowledge of the contents of any Ancient MS., or even a Reasonable knowledge of what is recorded in it.

A knowledge of the Ancient MSS. is commonly obtained in two distinct modes.

1st. From Authors who exhibit a Collective record of many MSS. 2nd. From Authors who exhibit a record of only a Single MS. It is desirable to examine each mode separately.

In relation to the 1st Mode, the present most esteemed of the New Testament Authors are Griesbach, Scholz, Lachmann, Tischendorf, Alford, and Tregelles; the Three first of whom are dead, and the Three last are living. Their claim respecting the number of the MSS. they exhibit is thus stated by one of them "The Greek New Testament, Edited from Ancient authorities, with the various Readings of all the Ancient MSS., and of the Ancient Versions, and of the earlier Ecclesiastical Writers (to Eusebius inclusive); together with the Version of Jerome, from the Codex Amiatinus of the Sixth Century."

This claim appears to me to be so extensive, as to make it desirable to restrict my observations on the subject to the Four Oldest and most generally esteemed of the Ancient MSS., viz., The Alexandrian, The Vatican, The Ephræmi, and the Beza or Cambridge MSS., (which are commonly referred to by the signs, Å. B. C. D.) being convinced, that what is proved to exist in relation to these MSS., must have existence in relation to every other MS.
