Introductory Note.

The greater part of the Library has been acquired through the good offices of Professor Leumann from Professor Hübschmann of the University of Strassburg. It originally formed the Sanskrit Library of Professor Siegfried Goldschmidt (who was Professor Leumann's predecessor in the University of Strassburg).*

Index I comprises original works and articles which are arranged according to their authors. It also mentions the editors, but the respective editions must be sought in Index II which is reserved for editions and translations and for Indian authors.

Japanese scholars interested in Sanskrit Literature may borrow books from the library here catalogued. They have simply to sign and send to the owner a card mentioning the titles of the books desired and stating the date upon which these books will be returned. The average limit of a loan would be a month, but it may be extended to two or even three months.

 Prof. Goldschmidt also possessed a Library of works on Comparative Philology which remains in the possession of Prof. Hübschmann.

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
