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PREFACE.

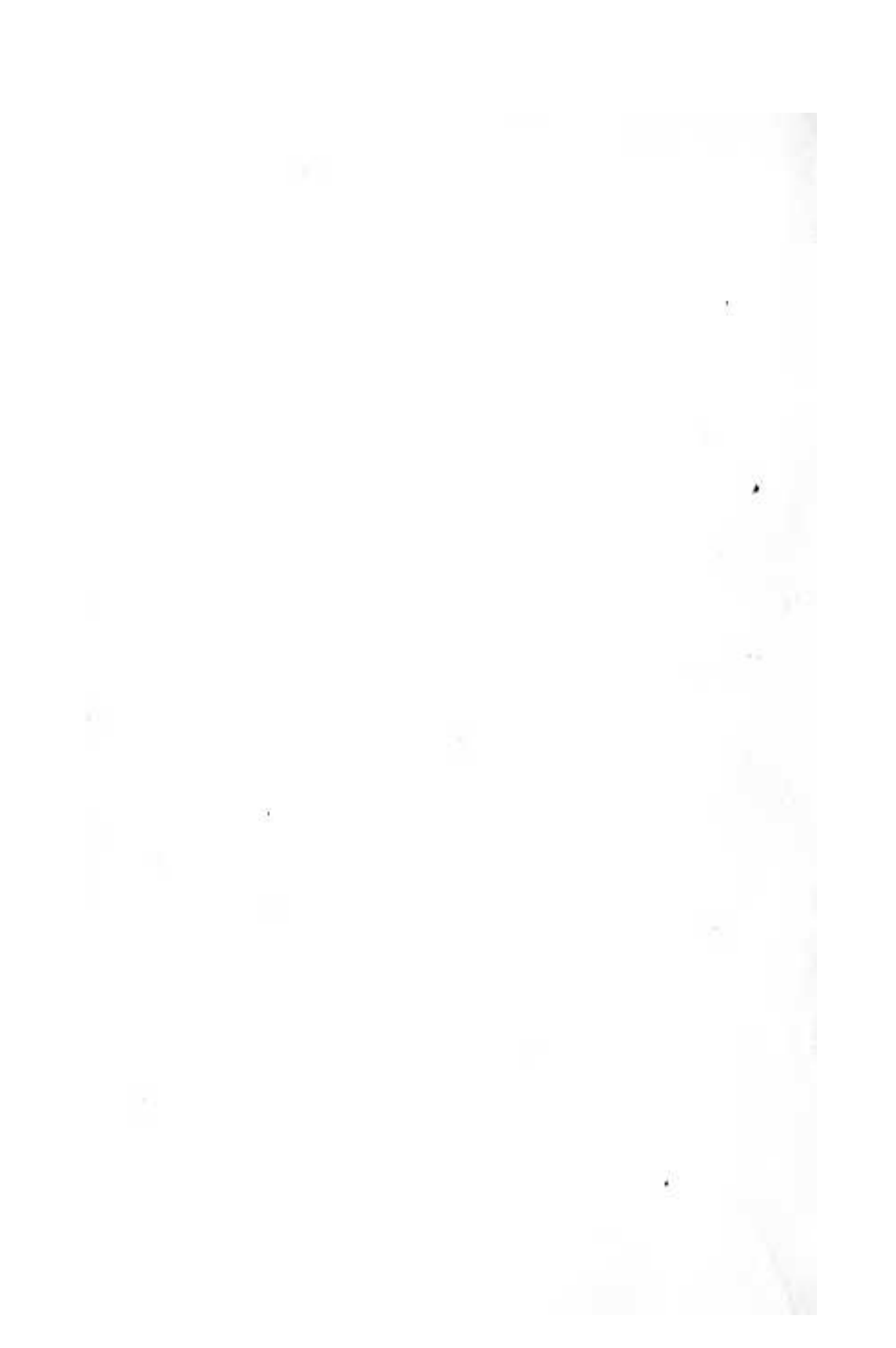
The importance of giving instruction in the public schools, upon the subject of civil government, can hardly be overestimated.
