INTRODUCTORY NOTE.

THE Idylls of the King was first published in 1859, but not in the complete form in which the collection now stands. The volume contained Geraint and Enid, Merlin and Vivien, Lancelot and Elaine, and Guinevere. In 1862 the dedication to the Memory of the Prince Consort was prefixed. In 1869 four new idylls were published in the volume entitled The Holy Grail and other Poems; these were The Coming of Arthur, The Holy Grail, Pelleas and Ettarre, and The Passing of Arthur. This last, however, is the Morte d'Arthur, first published in 1842, but provided now with an introductory passage, and with a concluding one in place of the conclusion, which in the earlier form professed to make the poem a fragment of a larger work. The Last Tournament appeared first in the Contemporary Review for December, 1871, and Gareth and Lynette was published as a separate volume in 1872. When the Library edition of Tennyson's Poems was published in 1873, all of these poems were arranged in the present order and the epilogue To the Queen added.



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
