THE following LIST of Estates, which was L collected by Authority in the Year 1715, is published at this Time, with no other View, but to assist the Magistrates, and other Officers. who shall happen to be intrusted with the Execution of such Orders of Government, as either have already been, or may hereafter be issued, for suppressing the Growth, and unhappy Effects, of the present rebellious Insurrection in the North; which, its hoped, will caution the Possessors of such Estates, at this Juncture, carefully to keep within the Bounds, of their known duty, to our Gracious Sovereign King George, and his Rightful Government over them; unto which, it is conceived, they will find themselves more especially obligated, if they only please to observe, that many of them (who in the said Year neglected to give in such a particular Account of the Value of their respective Estates, as was then under severe Penalties required of them by Law,) were never, as yet, called upon to answer for such Neglect, but gently permitted to go on quietly, and to partake equally with their Fellow-Subjects, of all that Lenity and other blessed Effects, of a mild Administration in Government, which these Kingdoms have peacefully enjoyed, ever since the most joyful and happy
