INTRODUCTORY.

AN "OPEN LETTER" AND AN OPPORTUNITY.

THE "Boston Investigator" of Wednesday, March 9, contained "An Open Letter to the Clergymen of Boston," signed "Lemuel K. Washburn, Editor of the 'Boston Investigator.'" It called upon the clergy to answer certain questions,—such as "What do you mean by the word 'God'?" What "idea" do you mean to convey by the word? How do you know that there is a God? What is meant by the phrase "Father in heaven?" In reference to the "bible" general questions are put, as to its authorship, its authority as God's word, what makes it God's word, and so on.

The following is the "Open Letter" in full:
