PREFACE

AT the time of Mr Chapman's regretted death in December, 1913, the notes on chapters i—iv and §§ 1, 2 and 3, to the end of Division III, of the Introduction, were in print. The notes to the end of ch. xvi were found to be in a fairly complete form in MS.

Dr Streane kindly undertook at once to complete the work and be responsible for its final revision.

Thus § 1, 2, 3, I—III of the Introduction, a portion of § 4 of the same, the notes on chapters i—xvi and the introductory note on ch. xvii, together with Appendix I (a) (b) (c) (d) and Appendices II, IV, V are substantially Mr Chapman's work, although it has been carefully revised throughout by Dr Streane. For the remainder of the Introduction and Appendices and the notes on chapters xvii—xxvii, Dr Streane is directly responsible.
