#### THE CHARACTER OF KING EDWARD VII,

"NEVER was British Prince baptized under happier circumstances than Edward, Prince of Wales, the son of Queen Victoria. At a period of all but universal peace throughout the world, such as can scarcely be paralleled since the great epoch from which our religion takes its date, a peace commented not merely by mutual interests and the bonds of a common civilization, but by the growing recognition of deeper principles of duty-at this period our new Edward takes upon him the vows of a soldier in what is pre-eminently the kingdom of peace. "Our First Edward ravaged Scotland and Wales; our Third Edward, and his son, the gallant Black Prince, carried desolation into France. But Scotland and Wales belong to *this* Edward, and he to Scotland and Wales; and France is the nearest and most honoured ally of his Mother's Crown. May it be his office to consolidate good-will and unity throughout the world, and may war never be heard of in his time."
