#### INSPECTIONS.

Whole number of inspections made by me during the past year ending December 31st, 1895, was two hundred and ninety-three (293), which does not include extra or additional inspections, classified in following tabular statement.

Whole number of cotton, woolen, worsted goods, cotton and wool yarns, cotton battings and wadding manufacturing establishments in the State was one hundred and eighty (180). There was found employed in the one hundred and eighty mills as follows:
