ANNUAL ANNOUNCEMENT.

1886-87.

The twenty-seventh annual session of the New York Homcopathic Medical College will commence on Tuesday, October 5th, 1886. No important changes have taken place in the Faculty since the last announcement appeared. The course of instruction will remain practically the same as during the past year, and the term will cover a period of six months. The standard of entrance examinations will be maintained. Students must present credible certificates of good moral character and a diploma of graduation from a good literary and scientific college or high school, or a first grade teacher's certificate. Or lacking this, he must pass a thorough examination in the branches of a good English education, including mathematics, English composition, geography, U. S. history, and elementary physics or natural philosophy. (See " Examinations.") These requirements are the same as in all colleges of our school in the United States. Our Faculty is large and the instruction so arranged and divided that every department of medicine is thoroughly taught and personal attention given to each individual student, which would be impossible were the Faculty more limited in numbers.

During the past two years laboratory and clinical facilities have been increased, more microscopes purchased, and efforts made in every direction to maintain and enhance the thoroughness and practical character of the college instruction. The college occupies the upper half of the fine Ophthalmic Hospital building, which was erected and adapted for our college and under its direct supervision. These facilities and our central location are most advantageous, having as
