Subscriptions (5s. per autum) are received by any member of the Council, and by the Honorary Secretary, with whom the publicatives of the Society Sefor distribution, and from whom prospectages can be obtained.

GENERAL RULES.

- That the Society shall be called the Ossrante Society, and that he
 object shall be the publication of Irish Manuscripts relating to the Foulan
 period of our history, and other historical documents, with literal translations
 and notes.
- 2. That the management of the Society shall be vested in a President, Vice-presidents, and Council, each of whom must necessarily be an Irish scholar. The President, Vice-presidents, and Conneil of the Society shall be elected amountly by the management at a General Meeting, to be held on the Seventreanth Day of March, the Analysessary of the Society, or on the following Menday, in case St. Partick's Day shall fall on a Sunday. Notice of such meeting being given by public advertisement, inviting all the members to attend.
- 3. That the President and Council shall have power to elect a Treasurer and Secretary from the Members of the Council.
- The receipts and distractments of the Society shall be undited annually by two Auditors, elected by the Council; and the Auditors' Report shall be published and distributed among the members.
- 5. In the absence of the President or Vice-President, the Members of Council present shall be at liberty to appoint a Chairman, who will not thereby loss his right to vote. Three members of the Conneil to form a quorum.
- 6. The funds of the Society shall be distanced in payment of expenses incident to discharging the liabilities of the Society, especially in the publication department, and no avoidable expenses shall be incurred.
- Every member shall be critical to receive our corr of the Society's Publications; and twenty extra copies of euch work shall be printed for contingencies.
- 8. The funds of the Society shall be lodged in Bank, in the name of the President, Secretary, and Treasurer of the Society, or any three excurbers the Council may deem proper to appoint.
- The Council shall have power to elect additional members, and fill vacancies in its own body.
- Members of Council residing at an inconvenient distance from Dublin shall be at liberty to vote by proxy at elections.
- Manufership shall be constituted by the annual payment of Five Shillings, which sum shall become due on the lat of January in each year.
- The Osstante Society shall publish every year one volume, or more, if their funds enable them.
- 13. No change shall be made in these Rules, except at a General Meeting, and at the recommendation of the Council; the proposer and seconder of any motion for such change, shall lodge a notice of their intention in writing, with the Secretary, twenty clear days before the day of General Meeting.
- 14. That all matters relating to the Religious and Policies's differences prevailing in this country, he strictly excluded from the meetings and publications of the Society.

EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT,

READ ON THE 17TH DAT OF MARCH, 1983.

THE Oblianic Society, founded in 1853, has now published five volumes of Finnian Records, which otherwise had remained hidden from public knowledge.

The Council are gratified to have to state that their endeavours have been responded to with laudable cagernesa, both in this country and slaewhere.

Last year they were able to recken seven handred and forty-six Members; this year that number has increased to eight hundred and thirty-three. Besides this, they are happy to record that the offiliated Society of New York, under the management of distinguished Irish Scholars, already numbers one hundred and dixty Members.

In order to obviate inconveniences, the Council desire emphatically to impress upon all Members the necessity of forwarding their Subscriptions immediately when called upon.

Numerous Members, by a reprehensible went of promptitude in answering the circulars announcing that a work was published and their Subscriptions due, have caused grave inconvenience to the Society. They have increased by a considerable amount the working expenses (as the actount shows), and thus converted into waste what would otherwise have been applied to publish our country's ancient literature.

This fact will account for delays in our yearly publications.

The Council have, therefore, decided that all defaulters' names he struck off the rolls; and all Members, who have not paid up their last year's Subscription before the publication of our next volume, he excluded from the Society.

The Council cannot advice the printing of another work until the debt, though small, now due, be obliterated. This debt arises solely from the dilatory conduct of a jew Members.

It has been proposed by some Members of this Society, and decided by the Council, that Members so desiring shall be enabled to become Life Members on payment of Five Pounds.

It has been furthermore roled, that the number of Life Members be limited to twenty,
