PREFACE TO THE FOURTH EDITION.

BORN on April 5, 1837, in the year of Queen Victoria's accession, of which the whole nation is now celebrating the Jubilee, ALGERNON CHARLES SWINBURNE to-day attains the jubilee or fiftieth year of his own life, and may be therefore claimed as an essentially and exclusively Victorian poet. Of the half-century of life now completed, more than a quarter of a century has been devoted to fruitful and noble work in song and to work hardly less noble and fruitful in the field of criticism.

In issuing this new edition, revised throughout and brought down to date, of a bibliographical record originally published some four years ago, the Compiler cannot deny himself the pleasure of associating with the date the coincidence, not only of a double jubilee, but also of a double birthday.

Long distant may the day be when this record, already so goodly, can be made complete in a final sense, and collectors of the books of our greatest Victorian poet and critic be able to echo Lord Melbourne's callous expression of grateful relief that they can bind him up !

As on former occasions the Compiler invites the co-operation of literary correspondents and will be grateful to any one who will correct an error or supply an omission.

Edited by Mr. (now Professor) John Nichol (whose historical drama of Haunibal was noticed by Mr. Swinburne, in 1872, in the Fortnightly Review). The chief contributors were George Rankine Luke, the late T. H. Green, Professor Albert Venn Dicey, Mr. George Birkbeck Hill (author of " Johnson and his Circle"), and Algernon Charles Swinburne. Mr. Swinburne's contributions, five in number, included a very amusing parody, The Monomenias's Tragedy, the first Canto of a poem entitled "Queen Yscult," a paper on Marlowe and Webster, &c. &c.

CONGREVE, WILLIAM, short prose article, signed "A. C. S.," in The Imperial Dictionary of Universal Biography, a series of original memoirs of distinguished men of all ages and all nations, edited by John Francis Waller, LL.D. London: William Mackenzie [1857], vol i., p. 979.
