Changes in the Board during the year.

Mr. H. F. Blanford, F.R.S., having left India on furlough, vacated his Trusteeship in May 1887, and the Asiatic Society of Bengal, appointed Mr. A. Pedler to succeed him. Mr. H. B. Medlicott, F.R.S., resigned his Trusteeship on the 26th of April 1887, and the Trustees nominated Dr. W. King as Trustee in his place. Lient.-Col. R. V. Riddell, R.E., resigned his Trusteeship in June 1887, and the Trustees nominated Lient.-Col. G. S. Neill as Trustee in his place.

Raja Rajendra Mullick, Rai Bahadur, who had been a Trustee since June 1869, died on the 14th April, and the Government of India appointed Surgeon-Major G. King, M.B., Superintendent of the Royal Botanical Gardens, Seebpore, to the vacant Trusteeship.

Mr. J. F. Finlay became an *ex-officio* Trustee during the time he officiated as Accountant-General from August to December 1887.

The Finance Committee has had twelve regular meetings, at which the accounts have been examined and the expenditure controlled.

There were six meetings of the Visiting Committee-at which all matters relating to the internal management of the Museum were discussed before suggesting measures for the orders of the Trustees in meeting, and the collections inspected.

A special Sub-Committee was held in December, to examine and report on the action of tin on specimens of economic products, and another was held in January 1888, to consider the plans of the new building for the economic collections.

A special meeting of the Trustees was held on the 2nd of February 188% to discuss the question of maintaining a competent establishment for the proper working out, in a scientific manner, of the various collections now in charge of the Indian Museum, and also to consider the question whether the systematic study of Economic Entomology can be taken up by any one of the officials of the Indian Museum.
