On looking over the title page of my book, the reader has probably fallen into more than one mistake. Seeing Paradise Regained at the heading, he has perhaps said-what demand for a new edition of a poem of Milton, which the concurrent opinion of the best critics has pronounced an inferior production! Reading further, he discovers his mistake. This then is not Milton's-a new work! The man has never heard that there was such a person as John Milton, or that he wrote a work of the same title; or if he has heard those things, he must be a fool, to take such a title, as will necessarily remind every reader of a poem, which however, comparatively, of an inferior grade, was still the production of Milton!
