TO THE CLASS OF NINETY-FOUR.

The Secretary submits herewith the record of the class since graduation. The record, though not complete, is as nearly complete as the secretary's time and the class postage fund would permit. Most of the men replied promptly, several have not yet replied and a few doubtless never will reply. One man returned the secretary's circular with the comment, "If the form of your request (on enclosed leaflet) were less undignified, I might feel more willing to give it attention." The secretary is sorry if his lack of dignity prevents anybody from doing his duty to the class and from receiving a copy of the report.

I regret to record the deaths of five members of the class since the publication of the first Report: Emanuel Benedict, Edgar McClure, Charles

Ziba Smith, William Joseph Whitney, Benjamin Snattinger.

It will be noticed that the list of members of the class is somewhat shorter than in the first Report. I have omitted the names of temporary members of the class who graduated with other classes, and in the next Report shall omit the names of certain temporary members and special students who either are beyond reach or do not desire to retain their connection with the class. This list at present includes the following names: G. Allis, H. H. Fisher, S. C. Kebabian, F. H. Ransom, L. Stern, E. C. Green, J. H. P. Howard, C. O. Jenkins, G. W. Johnston, H. Means, S. Mijoshi, J. Ridout, J. F. Smith, H. W. Thayer, P. B. Thompson, W. S. Woods. If anybody can give incorpation as to those men or show that they should remain in the class, the anamés will not be dropped.

It will be noticed further that in the arrangement of the various sections of the class, no distinction has been made between graduates of the College and graduates of the Scientific School, and none between temporary members and special students associated with the class. In the list of addresses at the end of the book, no distinctions of any kind have been made. As time goes on, scholastic criteria naturally become less significant. In reality there are only two designations that an adequate survey of the class membership demands—the one for those who answer the secretary's circulars, and the other for those who do not.

A word should be said as to the form in which the little autobiographies are given. In some cases I have quoted directly from letters, but in most cases have amalgamated the scattered facts which answer the various questions on the circular, and have included the whole in quotation marks. Additional facts which have come to my notice I have included in brackets. The labor of the secretary. I may say, would be lightened a hundredfold if each member of the class would prepare his report in connected literary form, written on only one side of the paper. I hope that my present device has not


exhibited the more retiring members of the class in an unduly selfgratulatory attitude. I shall certainly welcome any criticism on this point, or any correction of details.

I have reserved the place of honor and of emphasis in this preface for a plea in behalf of the class fund, or rather for a reference to the Treasurer's Report on p. 176, which exceeds in ferror and in cogency anything that I can say. Our imminent penury is no matter for conventional jesting; it demands the immediate attention of every self-respecting member of the class.
