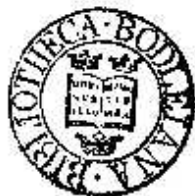

P R E F A C E.

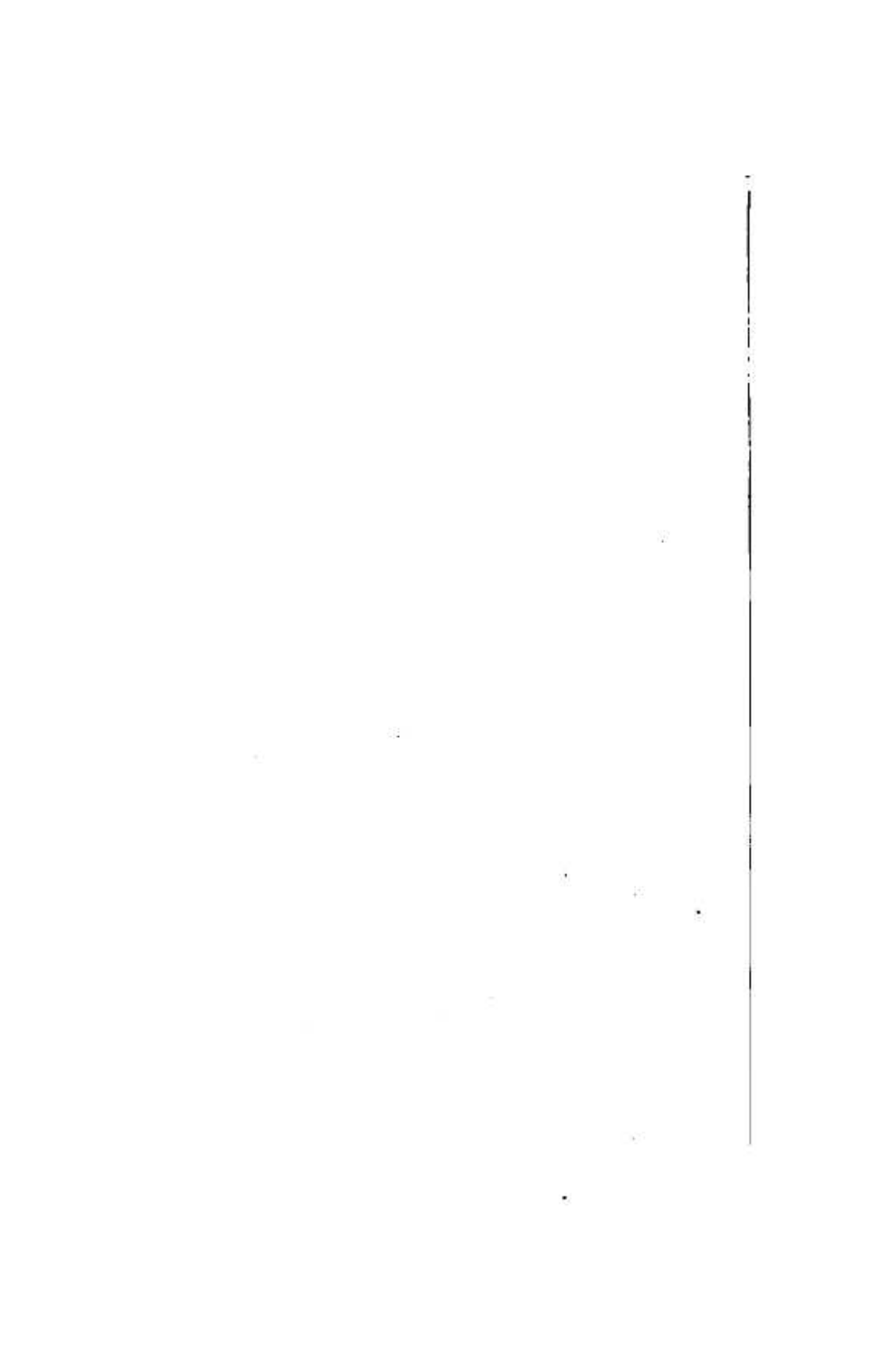
THE great and useful changes effected by the recent Statute in the Practice of Removals of the Poor, not only excuse but demand a new book upon the subject.

Instead of a mere reprint of the statute, the Author has preferred to sketch briefly the Procedure, as now regulated, and to include the forms as adapted to the new Law.

He has not deemed it necessary to enter minutely into all that portion of the Law of Removal and of Appeal not affected by the recent Statute, as it would greatly have increased the bulk, and consequent cost, of the volume. But he has endeavoured to state, with some minuteness, so much of it as the new Statutes have changed or modified, and briefly to describe the rest, so that the Practitioner may find in the following pages an *outline* of the Law and Practice as it is.

It has also been deemed desirable to introduce the Poor Removal Act (9 & 10 Vict. c. 66), with the judicial decisions lately pronounced upon its construction, that the whole subject might be before the reader.
