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
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
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

I know not whether you are furrounded with affectionate fympathy, or whether you are defolate (fo far as this world is concerned) in your mifery. Young or old, male or female, I know not who you are, and never And you are, (and I defire ihall know. that you fhould remain) in like ignorance with refpect to me; for if I fpeak well, according to the Church's teaching, and the truth of God, to God be the glory ! I defire no higher reward than that of being permitted to be an inftrument in His Hands, Who comforteth us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort them which
