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

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PREFACE

In May of 1915 this study was presented to the Faculty of Arts and Sciences of Leland Stanford Junior University in partial fulfillment of the requirements for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy. It is now being published in the hope that it may throw some light on the customs and manners of the English people of the thirteenth, fourteenth, and fifteenth centuries, on the entirely conventional habits of thought and expression as found in the literature of the time, and on the debt of Middle English literature to other literatures of medieval times. Within the restricted limits of the field of research, my prime object, both in the collection and in the presentation of material, has been thoroness and accuracy; so that those who may be interested in this particular subject may find here a reasonably trustworthy work of reference.

I gratefully acknowledge my indebtedness to the authorities of the University, and my specific obligations to Professors H. D. Gray, O. M. Johnston, and Dr. A. G. Kennedy, and especially to Professor R. M. Alden, under whose direction this dissertation was completed, for his sympathetic advice and invaluable suggestions. I wish also to pay high tribute to the inspiring example of sound scholarship and patient and penetrating criticism of my master, the late Doctor Ewald Flügel, under whose guidance this work was begun and almost finished.
