

#### Ghancellor.

#### **CHARLES HENRY GORDON-LENNOX.**

Duke of Richmond, and (1876) Gordon. D.C.L., Oxon., 1870. Elected in 1861 Second Chancellor of the University of Aberdeen, which was constituted in 1860 by the Union of University and King's College (1494), and Marischel College and University (1593).

### Sord Rector.

#### MOUNTSTUART ELPHINSTONE GRANT DUFF.

B.A., Oxon. (2nd Class, Litt. Hum.), 1850. LL.B., Lond., 1854, with Honours in the Principles of Legislation. Called to English Bar, 1854. Elected Rector for term 1866-69; re-elected for term 1869-72. Now Governor of Madras Presidency.

### Farliamentary Representatives.

#### JAMES MONORIEFF.

LLD., Edinb., 1858. LLD., Glasg, 1879. Called to Scottish Bar, 1833. M.P. for the Universities of Glasgow and Aberdeen, 1868-69. Rector of the University of Edinburgh, 1868-71. Raised to the Bench, as Lord Justice-Clerk of Scotland, 1869; and to the Peerage of the United Kingdom, as Baron Moncrieff of Tullybole, 1874.
