Yes; Section 9, Army Act, 1881, states:— "Every person subject to military law who "commits the following offence, that is to say, "disobeys in such a manner as to show a wilful "defiance of authority, any lawful command "given personally by his superior officer in the "execution of his office, whether the same "is given orally, or in writing, or by signal, "or otherwise, shall, on conviction by court-"martial be liable to suffer death or such less "punishment as in this Act mentioned."
