Q. Is disobedience of a signalled order punishable by military law ?

A. Yes ; Section 9, Army Act, 1881, states :—
“ Every person subject to military law who
“ commits the following offence, that is to say,
“ disobeys in such a manner as to show a wilful
“ defiance of authority, any lawful command
“ given personally by his superior officer in the
“ execution of his office, whether the same
“ is given orally, or in writing, or by signal,
“ or otherwise, shall, on conviction by court-
“ martial be liable to suffer death or such less
“ punishment as in this Act mentioned.”
