EXPORTS FROM THE SEVERAL COUNTRIES

TO THE
UNITED STATES.

The following statements, compiled in the Bureau of Statistics, Department of State, from consular returns, show the nature and value of the products declared for export to the United States at the consulates and commercial and consular agencies of the United States in the several countries.

The statements cover the calendar year 1892, unless when otherwise specified.

Though other Government publications show the exports from the several countries to the United States, this is the only one which mentions the districts within the several countries wherein the exports for the United States have their origin—wherein they are manufactured—for, although in some cases goods are “declared” in districts in which they are not produced (foreign goods in Liverpool and London, for instance), yet the rule is that goods are declared in the districts of production.

The statements are arranged according to continents, viz, Europe, America, Africa, Asia, Australasia, and Polynesia. The countries, according to continents, are alphabetically arranged, as are also the consulates in the several countries. The consular agencies are arranged under their respective consulates.

The analytical index will enable the reader to trace any product or manufacture to the several districts in which it originated, and to see, at a glance, the amount declared in the several districts.

All goods intended for export to the United States must be “declared” at the nearest American consulate or commercial or consular agency. The various forms of declarations are as follows:

Declaration to be indorsed on the invoice and signed by the purchaser, or duly authorized agent of such purchaser, where merchandise has been actually purchased.

when, the place where, and the person from whom the same was purchased, and the actual cost thereof, and all charges thereon; that no discounts, bounties, or drawbacks are contained in said invoice but such as have been actually allowed thereon; that no different invoice of the merchandise mentioned in said invoice has been or will be furnished to anyone; and that the currency in which said invoice is made out is that which was actually paid for said merchandise. And I further declare that it is intended to make entry of said merchandise at the port of _____, in the United States of America.

Declaration to be made by the seller on behalf of the purchaser where merchandise has been actually purchased.

I, _____, of _____, in _____, do solemnly and truly declare that I am the seller and shipper of the merchandise in the annexed invoice mentioned and described, which was purchased from me by _____, of _____, in the United States; that the said invoice was made at _____, in the consular district of _____, whence the said merchandise is to be exported to the United States, and that it is in all respects true; that it contains a true and full statement of the time when, the place where, and the person from whom the merchandise therein mentioned was purchased, and the actual price paid, or to be paid, to me by the purchaser, to whom I have sold the same in the ordinary course of trade, and for whom I now act in producing this invoice, together with a true statement of the quantity thereof, and of all charges thereon; that no discounts, bounties, or drawbacks are contained in the said invoice but such as have been actually allowed thereon; that the currency in which the said invoice is made out is the currency which was actually paid, or is to be paid, for the said merchandise; and that no different invoice thereof has been or will be furnished to anyone.

I further declare that it is intended to make entry of the merchandise mentioned in the said invoice at the port of _____, in the United States of America.

Declaration to be indorsed on the invoice and signed by the manufacturer or owner, or duly authorized agent of such manufacturer or owner, where merchandise has been obtained otherwise than by purchase.

I, _____, of _____, do solemnly and truly declare that I am the _____ of the merchandise in the within invoice mentioned and described; that the said invoice is in all respects correct and true, and was made at _____, whence said merchandise is to be exported to the United States; that said invoice contains the actual market value or wholesale price of the said merchandise at the date hereof in the principal markets of _____; that said actual market value is the price at which the merchandise described in the invoice is freely offered for sale to all purchasers in said markets, and that it is the price which I would have received, and was willing to receive, for such merchandise sold in the ordinary course of trade in the usual wholesale quantities, and that it includes all charges thereon and the actual quantity thereof, and that no different invoice of the merchandise mentioned in the said invoice has been or will be furnished to anyone. And I further declare that it is intended to make entry of said merchandise at the port of _____, in the United States of America.
