
PREFACE



NOTE ON THE PRONUNCIATION OF-POLISH NAMES

C = ts.

Ć, ci, =a soft English ch.

Ch=strongly aspirated h, resembling ch in Scotch loch.

Cz = ch, as in charm.

Dz = j.

J = y.

L = a peculiarly Polish letter, roughly speaking to be pronounced between u and w.

0 = 00, as in mood.

Rz=the French j, as in Jean.

Ś, si, =a slightly hissed and softened sound of sh.

W = v.

 \dot{z} , zi = French j.

The stress in Polish falls almost invariably on the penultimate syllable.
