Most authorities are named, but not all. It would be useless to cite, unless in exceptional cases, the works of Dr. Moore and Dr. Toynbee and the concordance of Messrs. Sheldon and White, as they have been used continually, and are of course indispensable to every English student of Dante. Latin and Italian names have been used perhaps somewhat indiscriminately, but it was found difficult to be consistent. For instance, few would recognise Bartolus under his Italian name or Cino under his Latin one.
