PREFACE.

HE book now presented to liturgical students is a reprint of the first text of the Reformed Breviary of Cardinal Quignon. Copies of this first text are very rare; doubt has been even expressed by bibliographers whether any part of the recension had survived beyond the few pages of the preface that are preserved in the great Library at Paris in the Rue de Richelieu.

This text of the Breviary was in use only from February 1535 to July 1536. During this short time there appeared at

least six editions; to wit:

Registrum follows regulæ generales, and on the same page as registrum is a table of errata to which reference will often be made in the notes. In many parts of the text the red has also been obliterated by black lettering. This edition is full of misprints.

In this copy sheet C is wanting; it contained the psalter from the none of Monday to the none of Tuesday.

 A fragment of an edition is preserved in the National Library at Paris, as Pièce unique. (17667.)

It consists of 8 leaves: Roman type, number of lines 31 or 32. The printed surface is 128 × 78 or 125 × 77 mm.

At the top of the first page there is: Breviarium Romanum ex sacra | potissimum scriptura et proba | tis. Sanctorum Historiis con | stans M.D.XXXV. | (in black capitals), followed immediately underneath by: * Ad Sanctifs. Patrem et D.N. Paulum III., and the rest follows as in other editions. It contains the vt in the first page left out by P. and also in Thielman Kerver's edition.

The piece ends with the brief of Paul III. to Antonio Blado.

At first sight it looks like a fragment of R, but R, does not repeat the title before the address of the preface: nor is the sign * before the address. Nor does the pagination or lineation correspond. Thielman Kerver's edition. (Bibliothèque nationale, Paris.)

Mr Blew's copy, taking the results of a short examination of the two books together, seems to follow this edition rather closely.

The licence with the Pope's signature has been printed from this edition, and also the privilege du roy.

These are all the editions of the first text that I have as yet met with. No doubt there are others still undiscovered, although I have searched carefully in many libraries in Italy and also in France. R. seems to be the first edition; besides the many errors of the press, the rubrics have often been
