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PROFESSOR RODOLFO LANCIAN1 needs no introduction to English readers.



Much of the new material thus collected will appear in fuller form in an extensive work, comprising several volumes, which will be published in Italian under the title *Storia degli Scavi di Roma*. The present volume is a forerunner of the larger work.
