THE Alphabet consists of eighteen letters :--

Vowela, a, e, i, o, u;

Consonants, b, c, d, f, g, h, l, m, n, p, r, s, t.

a, o, u, are called broad vowels.

e, i, are called small vowels.

bh, ch, dh, fh, gh, mh, ph, sh, th, are called aspirates.

c, d, g, l, n, r, s, t, are termed linguals; b, bh, f, m,

p, labials ; m, n, mh, nasals.

The various powers of each and all of these letters and combinations are fully explained and exemplified in the Introduction to the Vocabulary.
