With reference to the Visitations of Sussex, the late Dr. Marshall, F.S.A., York Herald (a member of the Council), in his "Notes on the

Heralds' Visitations," which appeared in the "Genealogist," New Series, vol. iii., p. 36 (London, 1886), states:---

"If we except such pedigrees as have been printed by Berry in his Genealogies of this County, nothing has been done towards printing its Visitations, which were made in 1530 by Benoite (College of Arms, D. 13), in 1674-5 by Cooke (College of Arms, D. 11 and G. 18), in 1634 by St. George, containing 300 pedigrees (College of Arms, C. 27), and lastly by Bysshe, began in 1682 and finished in 1683 (College of Arms, D. 16)."

Anything within brackets, thus [ ], will of course be understood as explanatory interpolations by the Editor.
