TO THE CLASS OF 1863.

IN preparing the following Report, I have followed the theory adopted in all my previous Reports, — that of giving an account of the lives of the several members of the Class since the publication of the last previous Report; except when I have received information not printed in any former Report. This Report, therefore, covers the time from June, 1875, to June, 1883. Out of one hundred and twenty-three living classmates, including those who did not receive degrees, I have received responses from one hundred and nine to my circular letter of March 1, 1883. The substance of these responses is embodied in the following pages.

It should always be remembered that the Report is “printed for the use of the Class,” and it is hoped, therefore, that the sketches will not seem to be of too personal a nature.

Since the publication of the last Report, MARSTON has received the degree of A.B., and we have lost by death, FULLERTON, MARVINE, HEN, and W. F. JENKS. I thought it would be pleasant to include in this volume portraits of these classmates, who have recently died, and of BROOKS and DAVIS, who died just before the Report of 1875 was printed, and upon whose death the Class took formal action at the annual meeting of that year. The picture of BROOKS is from a steel-engraved plate, owned by his family. The pictures of DAVIS, FULLER-

TON, MARVINE, and HUN are heliotypes, printed by the Heliotype Printing Company of Boston, from negatives taken by different photographers. The picture of W. F. JENKS is a phototype, printed by F. Gutekunst, of Philadelphia, from a negative taken by himself. The plates and photographs have been kindly loaned by the several families whenever necessary.

I have added an APPENDIX, which includes some facts and memorials of college life never before printed. My first thought was to retain this matter for the Report on our twenty-fifth anniversary, but I have concluded that sufficient time has already elapsed since leaving college to make these memorials interesting reading now.

This is the TWENTIETH ANNIVERSARY of our graduation, and I hope this Report will contribute somewhat to the pleasure and profit of our meeting, and be an interesting memorial of the occasion.
