The following table shows the results of the experiment. The first column is the number of trials, the second column is the number of correct responses, and the third column is the percentage of correct responses. The fourth column is the number of trials that were not completed, and the fifth column is the percentage of trials that were not completed.

As can be seen from the table, the number of correct responses increases as the number of trials increases, but the percentage of correct responses remains relatively constant. This suggests that the subjects are learning the task as they go, but are not yet performing at a level of automaticity.
