**Preliminary Examination.**

*November 1876. (Including English Dictation. Time allowed: —  
2½ hours.)*

*Translate into English:*

La mendicité est une petite guerre à la générosité, à la sensibilité, à la patience des citoyens; il faut donc qu'un mendiant, comme un bon soldat, sache se mettre en embuscade. Ordinairement ils se postent aux endroits les plus fréquentés, mais où il devient difficile et même impossible d'éviter leurs importunités, tels que les ponts, et l'intérieur des temples; et, sur les routes, les montées, où, les chars se trouvant naturellement ralentis, ces solliciteurs ont plus de facilité pour les suivre, quand ils veulent bien se lever, car la plupart du temps ils sont assis à terre. Ils tendent la main d'une manière fort humble, et, la ramenant de temps en temps vers leur bouche, envoient des baisers à ceux qu'ils implorent. A Rome, leurs principaux rendez-vous sont le pont Sublicius et la porte Trigemina, deux endroits qui se touchent, point d'arrivée des voyageurs venant d'en deçà ou d'au-delà du Tibre; espèce de défilé où la route, resserrée entre le fleuve et le mont Aventin, force, pour ainsi dire, le passant nez à nez avec le mendiant.
