It has been attempted, both in the little story and in the other Easy Lessons, to make the reading really interesting. The whole book is original and specially written.


If schoolmistresses teach, in addition to a sound religious and moral education, needlework, and domestic economy, a real love for good reading, they will effect great permanent good in the country.
