Proper Nouns are the names of particular persons and places—as, Caesar, Caesar; Roma, Rome.

Common Nouns are the names of whole classes of persons, places, and things—as, Magister, the master; Urbs, a city; Ovum, an egg.

Abstract Nouns are the names of ideas (that is, of things perceived by the mind only)—as, Veritas, the truth.—Primer, pp. 4-10.
