## Preface.

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THESE two Volumes (XXXIII. and XXXIV.) contain the Marriage Licences issued by the Vicar-General of the Archbishop of Canterbury between the 25th day of July 1660 and the 15th day of July 1679, which were *omitted* by the late Colonel CHESTER in his transcript published by the Harleian Society in 1886 (Vol. XXIII., pp. 51—302).

The Society has also published (Vols. XXX. and XXXI.) the *whole* of the Marriage Licences in this Registry from the 16th day of July 1679 to the 30th day of June 1694.

These two Volumes therefore complete the whole series, which thus gives an abstract of *all* the Licences which are in the custody of the Vicar-General of the Archbishop of Canterbury, at Dean's Court, London, from the 25th of July 1660 (the earliest date) to the 30th of June 1694, a period of nearly thirty-four years.

From the 25th of July 1660 the entries are regular with the following exceptions, viz., (1) from January 2nd, 1663-4 (the end of one Volume), to February 13th, 1664-5 (the beginning of another), when they are missing; and (2) from September 2nd to September 22nd, 1666 (the time of the Great Fire), when also they are missing. From September 22nd, 1666, to November 1st, 1666, they are in a loose bundle—some granted October 31st and November 1st being recorded in the regular book.

These loose Licences are printed in Vol. XXIII., p. 122.

The following three Licences are loose, but in the same bundle, viz. :—

From the 30th of June 1694 (at which date these abstracts terminate) the Licences are kept at Lambeth Palace, and the Index at the Office in Dean's Court only mentions the surnames of the parties and the date of the Licence.

The Society is deeply indebted to Sir JOHN HASSARD, the Principal Registrar of the Diocese, for the facilities given for making these valuable transcripts.

The earlier part of the transcript of these Volumes was made by the late Mr. J. EEDS, whose valuable services for a period of over twenty years it is a pleasure to record. They have been completed by his successor, Mr. A. H. HEPPELL.
