PREFACE

TO

THE FIRST EDITION.

ABSTRACTS OF TITLES have long been the subject of complaint, not less on account of the confused and ambiguous manner in which the material parts of the deeds and instruments are commonly stated, than the inartificial mode of arrangement adopted; both of which occasion considerable trouble and embarrassment to persons perusing them. Conveyancers have, therefore, repeatedly suggested the necessity of observing a more careful and systematic preparation of these documents, and have pointed out the many advantages that would result therefrom, not only to the profession, but to the parties interested. But from some cause or other, not readily conceived, unless it may be attributed to the want of some general precedent, those suggestions have hitherto been attended with little success.

Titles, however, are now required to be so strictly scrutinised upon all occasions of transfer of property, and the responsibilities of counsel in advising upon them are become so considerable, that it is still more expedient to remove the cause of complaint before alluded to, and, at the same time, to reduce those responsibilities, by adopting generally the system so frequently recommended.

With a view, therefore, of promoting this end, the author of the following pages is induced to lay them before the profession; trusting that they will be found to contain a model of such system, and that they will, consequently, have the desired effect.
